Dear Foundation Colleague:

This directory is a "Yellow Pages" for Northeast Ohio foundations that may make grants to the over 600 nonprofit organizations in our region that focus to some degree on economic development. It lists contact information, focus area, and resources— mainly funding and people.

Just as there has been a proliferation of foundations in the last 20 years, so too have nonprofit organizations multiplied. If your board is like ours, it is often difficult to keep these organizations straight and to be able to get additional information about them quickly. We hope this resource will be valuable to you.

Northeast Ohio means different things to different people. This directory covers a 17-county area: Ashland, Ashtabula, Columbiana, Cuyahoga, Erie, Geauga, Huron, Lake, Lorain, Mahoning, Medina, Portage, Richland, Stark, Summit, Trumbull, and Wayne. The 2000 Census counted approximately 4.35 million people in the region. The most populous county is Cuyahoga, with about 1.4 million residents, followed by Summit with nearly 543,000. Each of these has a mix of tax-supported public agencies and nonprofit organizations active in economic development, and we have included both.

According to the American Economic Development Council, economic development is a "process of creating wealth through the mobilization of human, financial, capital, physical and natural resources to generate marketable goods and services."

Northeast Ohio has had problems with many of these economic development components. Ohio's loss of 212,700 manufacturing jobs in the last six years hit our region particularly hard, since only the government employs more people than manufacturing. The business community, nonprofits, governmental agencies, foundations and universities have all been working on strategies to restore the area to its former world competitiveness.

The Generation Foundation believes that the nonprofit world, and private/community foundations in particular, have a responsibility to aid the corporate and public sectors in achieving a growing economy that can create gainful employment for all citizens of Northeast Ohio. For years, we have advocated that foundations earmark at least 10% of their annual grants for economic development. That would be a lot, since collectively our 1,200 foundations disburse about \$360 million a year.

Our point here is that only a robust economy can produce the wealth that supports museums, health care, education, the arts and social services. Fortunately, more foundations are adding economic development to their focus areas, and 63, including us, have joined in forming the Fund for Our Economic Future, a \$30 million effort to stimulate economic development throughout our entire region.

We encourage your board to become familiar with the organizations listed in this directory and to be receptive to their initiatives to grow new companies, create new jobs, and thus raise the overall quality of life. This is the sole work of The Generation Foundation. Working collaboratively with other foundations to create a critical mass in funding, we concentrate on those innovative projects that have the greatest chance to strengthen our regional economy. How to Use the Directory

While the directory¹ is intended to identify nonprofit groups and initiatives that focus their resources, all or in part, on economic development, it will soon be apparent to even the casual user that numerous listings for for-profit, governmental and other organizations outside the nonprofit sector are also included. The explanation for this is the *relationship* of each to each other. In all cases, the inclusion of a group or initiative outside the nonprofit sector is a function a relationship (*link*) to a nonprofit in which resources are provided, received or shared. For the purpose of the directory, resources are defined as funding (grants), governance (usually the board of trustees) and personnel exchange (staff). This approach was taken to account for the *social capital* inherent to the relationships contained in the directory and to acknowledge that social capital is a key ingredient to any economic development process that intends to yield sustainable economic growth.

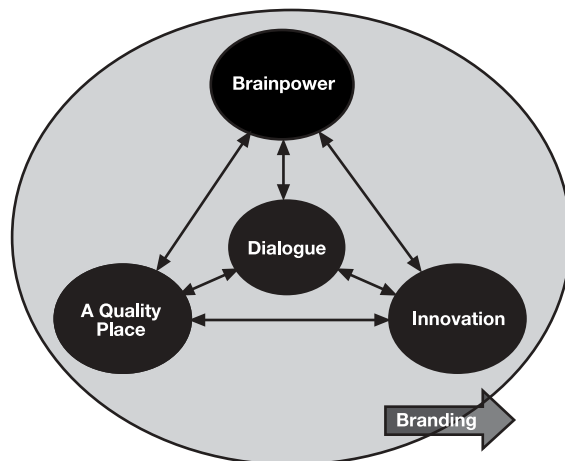
The directory is organized alphabetically. Three indices are contained at the end of the directory to facilitate the location of groups and initiatives:

- **The first index** provides the city/municipality in which a group or initiative is located. This index is alphabetically sequenced.
- **The second index** organizes each group or initiative by the economic development activities it engages. These activities are associated with specific Economic Development (ED) Focus Areas as defined by REI's Economic Development Roadmap (see below). REI's roadmap is governed by systems thinking applied to the *process* of economic development. As a function of REI's systems-based approach, REI assigns value to activities that many organizations may not recognize as being associated with the process of economic development.
- **The third index** is organized by the county within which the groups or initiatives are located. The city/municipality for each group or initiative is also included where available.

A group or initiative may be included in one or more ED Focus Area. Please see the discussion below for additional information relating to each ED Focus Area.

Directory contents² include listings (obtained from public sources or directly from the organizations and initiatives) containing the following information (where available):

- Organization/initiative name
- Contact information [Primary mailing address, website, phone number(s) and email address for chief executive]
- Mission profile or mission statement
- Economic Development (ED) Focus Area(s) [REI defined categories; Brain Power, Innovation, Quality Place (Physical Development), Dialogue/Inclusion, Branding (Marketing & Awareness), other]
- Annual Budget
- FTEs (full-time equivalents)
- Board appointments and staff listings (where available).

Economic Development Focus Area

By viewing economic development as a process, rather than an event, economic development becomes a set of tools, disciplines and interactions by which public officials, the private sector and activists nurture the conditions to enable economic growth. REI's economic development framework, the basis of this directory, organizes the ED process into inputs or focus areas. Identifying and quantifying activity in the each of the ED focus areas is a critical component of an economic development process that intends to yield sustainable economic growth.

ED Focus Area: a term referring to the economic development "building block(s)" that an initiative or group is intended to support, in order to cultivate growth. There are five focus areas in REI's working model, as described below.

Brainpower (BP): represents the individual creativity and skills needed to compete in a global economy.

Selected activities (including but not limited to):

- Early childhood education
- Primary education: K-12 education systems
- Higher education: Full- and part-time education above the high school level
- Workforce development: Skills assessment, employment services, adult training programs (basic and technical)
- Leadership development.

Innovation: represents the networks of innovation and entrepreneurship that translate brainpower into wealth through business development.

Selected activities (including but not limited to):

- Basic R&D: Initial, primarily conceptual and institutional research
- Applied R&D: Research aimed at solving practical problems. Conversion of basic intellectual property into near-market IP
- Technology transfer: The movement of ideas, inventions and discoveries out of the research lab, through the patent office, and into the commercial sector. Sharing and licensing of institutional IP with the private sector
- Commercialization: Conversion of raw intellectual property into marketable products
- Business capital: Pre-seed, seed, VC, bank, and other financing
- Business support and retention services
- Tax and other incentives
- Zoning and permitting assistance.

Quality Place: underscores the importance of building sustainable, connected places for individuals to live and businesses to compete. Activities focus on building places that are competitive, cool, and connected.

Selected activities (including but not limited to):

- Arts and culture
- Green space and environment
- Land assembly: Land acquisition policy and project-specific acquisition, including eminent domain use
- Health care
- Neighborhood development
- Transportation infrastructure: Roads and bridges, rivers and lakes, streets and highways, and public transit.
- Technology infrastructure
- Tax and zoning policy
- Water and/or sewer.

Marketing and Awareness (Branding): defines the challenge of telling the region’s story with clear concise messages

Selected activities (including but not limited to):

- Business attraction/retention
- Tourism
- Branding: the execution of a common strategy
(one of the toughest challenges in economic development)
- Advocacy and lobbying.

Dialog and Inclusion: underscores the importance of managing the process of economic development in order to build constituencies for different initiatives.

Selected activities (including but not limited to):

- Networking: The process of making, discovering, and utilizing connections between people for mutual, and in the case of economic development, regional and economic, gain
- Leadership development
- Policy research.

Each listing in the directory is subjectively assigned to 1 or more ED Focus areas (each associated with a different number from 1-6) as a function of the stated activities engaged by the group or initiative.

The legend for the six ED Focus areas contained in the directory is as follows:

1. Brainpower
2. Innovation
3. Quality Place; physical development
4. Marketing and Awareness; branding
5. Dialog and Inclusion
6. Other (activities not accounted for in the framework)

For example, a group engaged in funding early-stage business formation and early childhood education would be assigned to ED Focus Area 1 (Brainpower) for its activities associated with early childhood education and to ED Focus Area 2 (Innovation) for providing access to early-stage financial capital. Therefore, in the back of the directory, this fictitious group would be included in both the Brainpower ED Focus index listing and the Innovation ED Focus index listing.

Therefore, a group claiming to engage activities in multiple ED Focus areas will be found in the equivalent number of ED Focus area indices. However, each index reference for the group or initiative will direct the user to only one listing in the directory.
